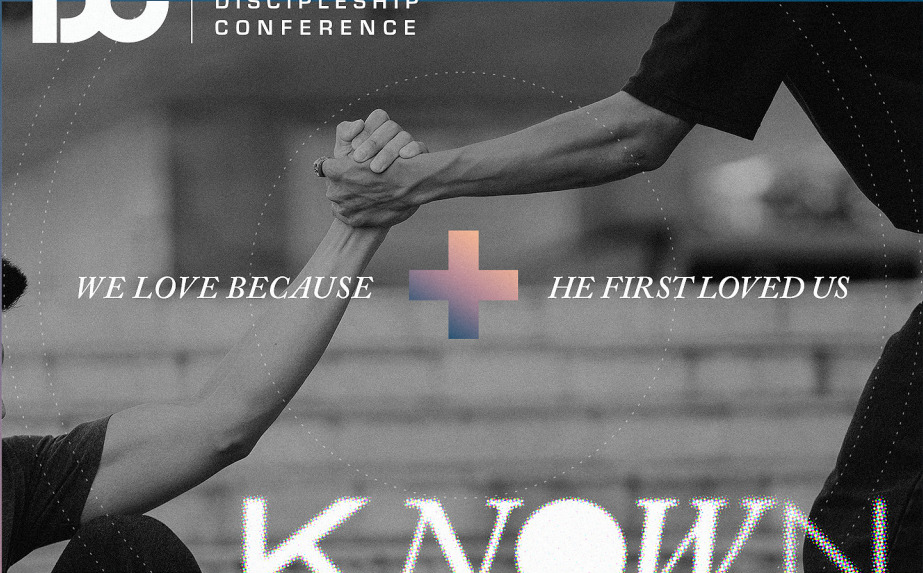

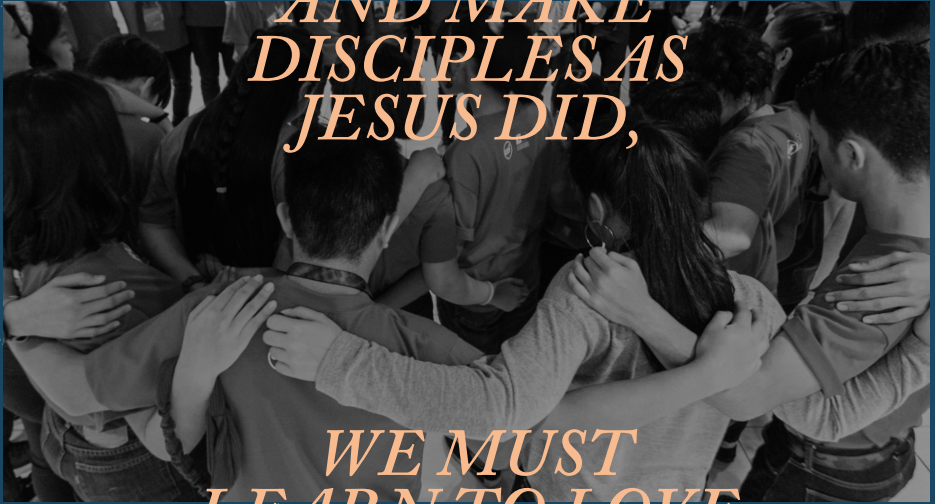

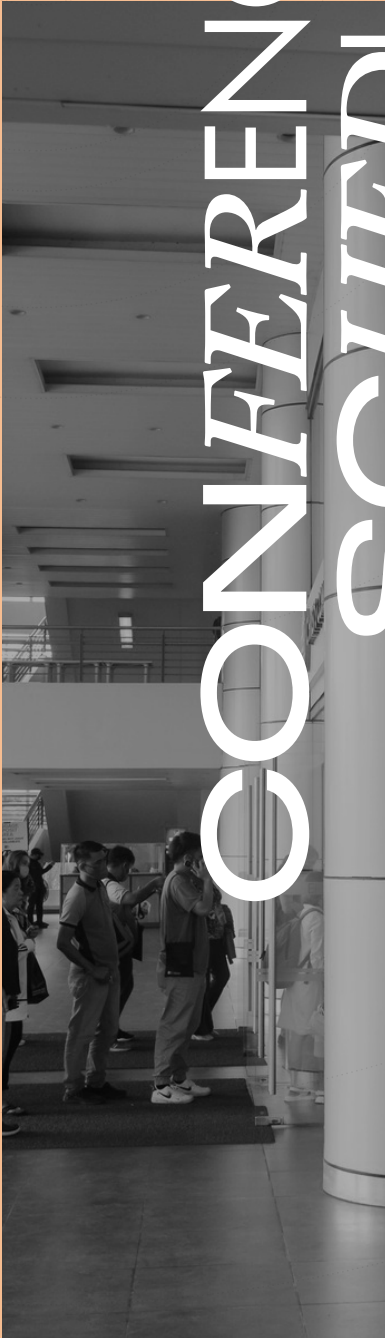

CONFERENCE SPEAKERS



REV. PAUL JEYACHANDRAN

Rev Paul Jeyachandran is considered by many to be a gifted preacher of the word of God and an able mentor! Over the past two decades, he has been actively engaged in mentoring church leaders, ministering to pastors in many nations and expounding the Scriptures at every God-given opportunity. He is the author of 4 books, director of IDMC Australia and leads an IDMC Movement to help bring churches back to their discipling roots.



DR. SEAN MCDOWELL

Sean McDowell is an assistant professor of Apologetics at Biola University. He graduated summa cum laude from Talbot Theological Seminary with a double master's degree in philosophy and theology. Like his dad, Sean is a Christian apologist who earned his PH.D. in Apologetics and Worldview Studies. He is the author, co-author, or editor of over fifteen books. His apologetics training has received exemplary status from the Association of Christian Schools International. Sean continues to teach one high school Bible class, which helps give him exceptional insight into the prevailing culture so he can impart his observations to educators, pastors, and parents alike. Traveling throughout the United States and abroad, he speaks at camps, churches, schools, universities and conferences. He is married to Stephanie with whom he has three children—Scottie, Shauna and Shane.



REV. EDMUND CHAN

Reverend Edmund Chan is a seasoned disciple-making pastor. The Leadership Mentor in Covenant Evangelical Free Church, Edmund is widely regarded as an insightful Bible expositor and a wise mentor of Christian leaders.

He is the Founder of the Global Alliance of Intentional Disciplemaking Churches. For over two decades he has been well known, locally and overseas, for his expository preaching and his mentoring of Christian leaders.

Graduating from the Singapore Bible College, he became pastor of a small church which has grown from 79 people to over 5,000. He has authored several books on disciplemaking and the inner life that are well received

In 2003, he completed his two-year Masters of Arts studies in under nine months, and graduated summa cum laude at the Trinity Evangelical Divinity School, USA.

He has been married for over thirty years to Ann, and they have two daughters, Amanda and Belicia.

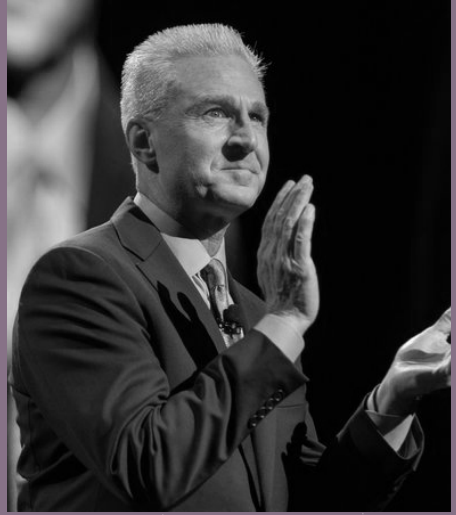


DR. PETER TAN-CHI

Peter Tan-Chi is the founder and senior pastor of Christ's Commission Fellowship (CCF). What began as a home Bible study in 1983 with a few unchurched couples has now grown to over 122 local and international satellites, and to which millions are tuning in worldwide.

He finished his Master's degree in management at the Asian Institute of Management and Doctorate degree in ministry at the International Graduate School of Leadership. He was recognized as a Distinguished Alumni of the UP College of Business Administration with the UPAA Distinguished Award in Entrepreneurship and Employment Creation.

He co-authored a book with his wife Deonna, on successful parenting entitled "MOTIVATE", which shares biblical principles they applied in raising their five children who are now all grown-ups, married and have given Peter and Deonna twenty-two grandchildren to date!



JACK HOLLIS

Jack Hollis is executive vice president of Toyota Motor North America (TMNA). He is also president of Toyota Motor Sales.

In his role, Jack is responsible for product planning, sales, marketing, distribution and customer service for the Toyota and Lexus brands in North America.

Most recently, Hollis served as senior vice president of automotive operations at TMNA where he was responsible for leading all sales, market representation, marketing and customer relations activities for the Toyota and Lexus brands, and for Puerto Rico and Mexico.

Hollis has twice been named an Automotive News All-Star; in 2017, he was named by Business Insider one of the 50 most innovative CMOs in the world, and in 2018 he was named to the AdWeek 50.

Hollis holds a bachelor's degree in economics from Stanford University. He was also a member of Stanford's NCAA National Baseball Championship team and the Cincinnati Reds for two seasons.

<p>Humility Rate yourself from 1-10 of how humble you are in the workplace. What can you do to become humble in the workplace?</p>	
<p>Gossiping What can you do to stay away from gossiping and point people to Jesus?</p>	
<p>Feedback What can you do to respond in Christlikeness to constructive criticism or feedback from colleagues or supervisors?</p>	
<p>Taking Credit for Others' Work How do you ensure that credit is given where it's due in collaborative projects or initiatives?</p>

<p>Accountability How do you ensure that you take responsibility for your actions and decisions at work?</p>	



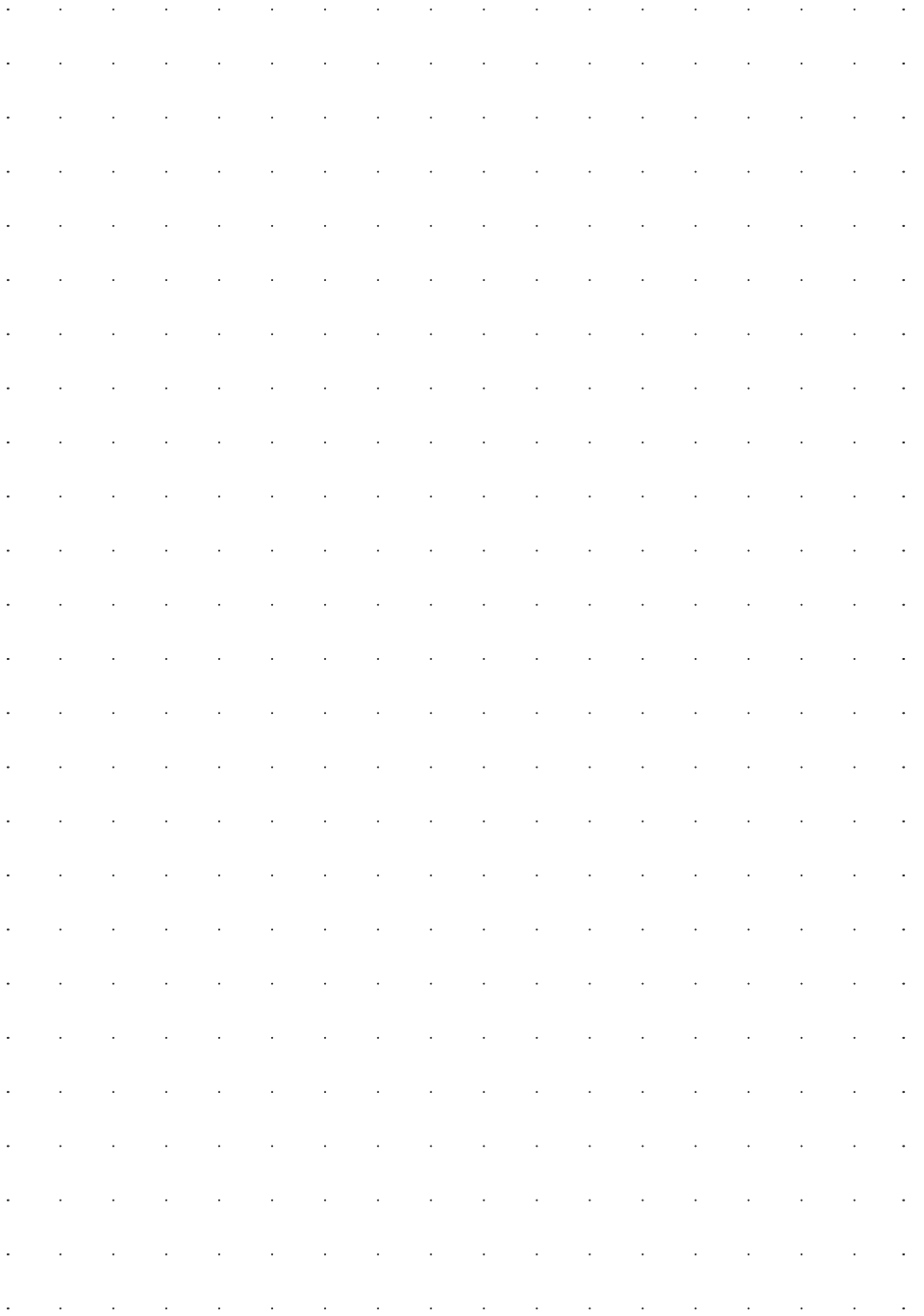

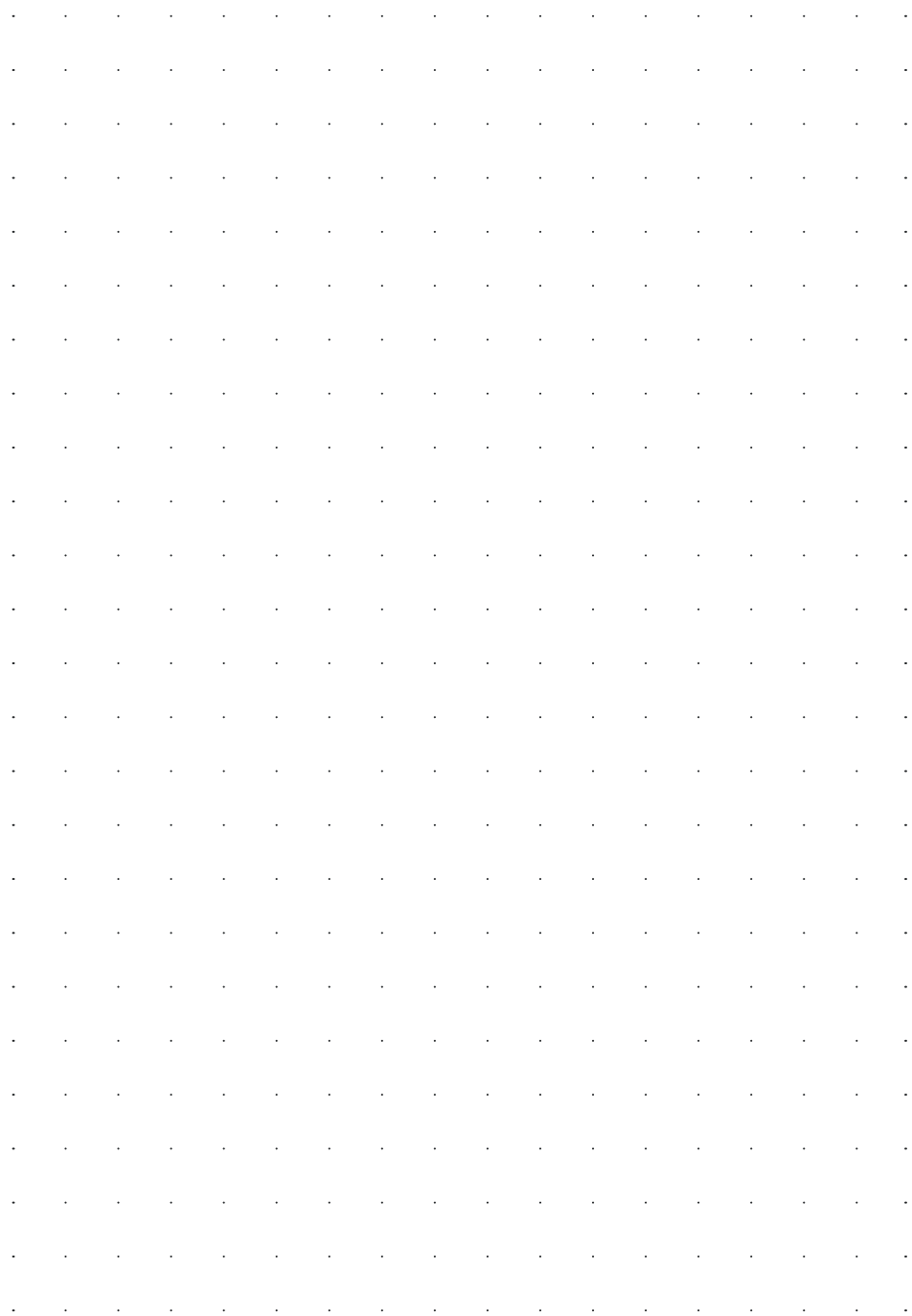
CONQUERING BARRIERS IN LOVING OTHERS

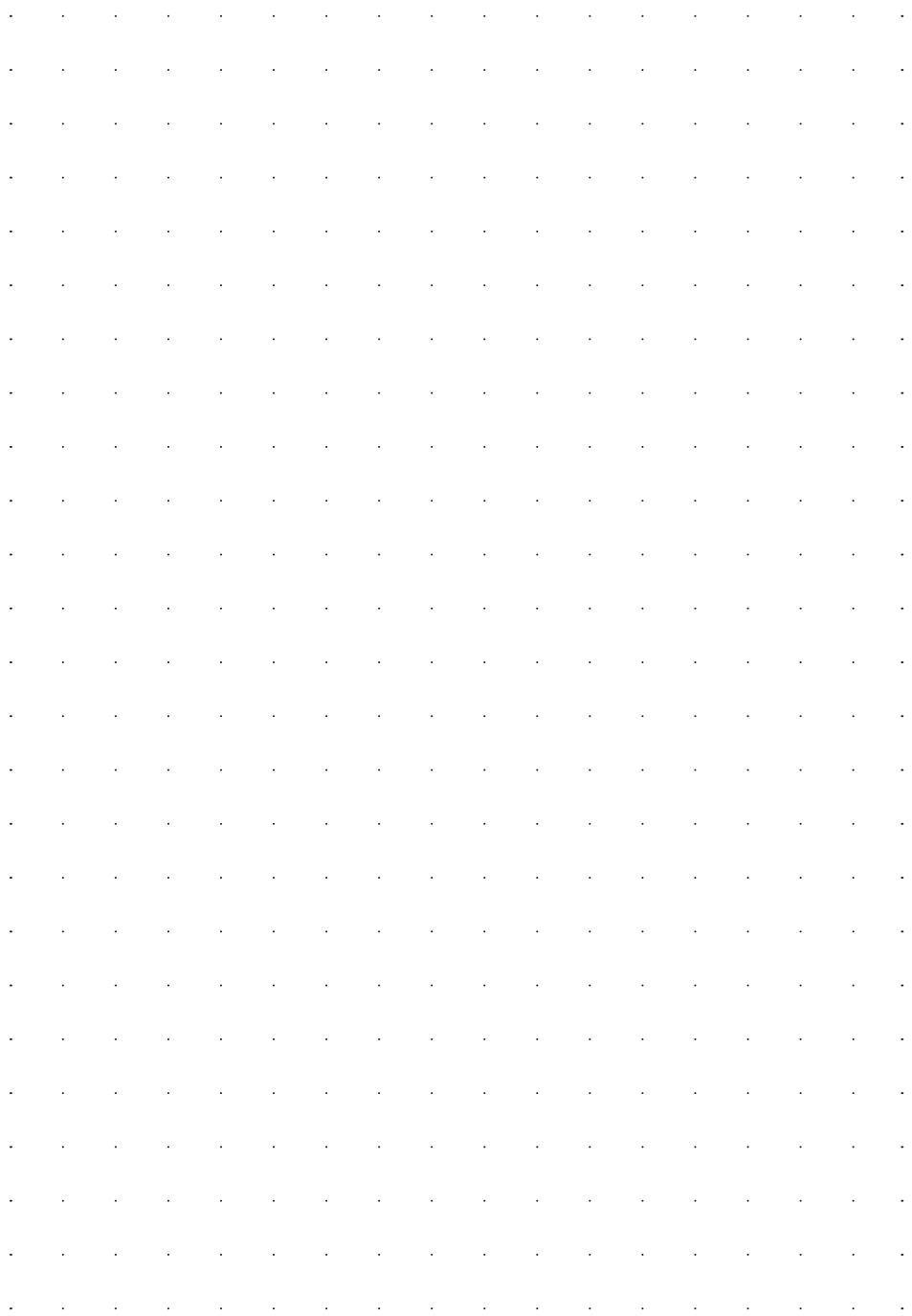
